Report of the Seminar

INAUGURAL SESSION

Date: 11th April, 2017 Time: 10.00 AM

The ICHR sponsored Two-Day National Seminar was started off with the Inaugural Session. The Session began with the lighting of the traditional lamps by the Principal of the College Dr. A.C. Das. This was followed by the introduction of the Resource Persons, Key-note Speaker. Then the teachers and students of the college presented the welcome song. Mr. TralokyaKalita, Joint Coordinator gave the welcome speech for all present. The theme of the Seminar was introduced by Mr. Pankaj Teron, Co-ordinator of the organising committee for the seminar. He spoke on the concepts associated with the theme; besides outlining the related sub-themes to be covered up in seminar.

The Key-note address was delivered by Dr. Michael Heneise, Centre for South Asian Studies. He spoke quoting Michael Focault on how history began. He noted what indigenous history is all about. He regretted that in the National History there is no mention of north-east History. He referred to the post apartheid history of South Africa. He further interestingly referred to indigenous Olympics in Brazil. He had suggested that the Karbi historians should take the lead in having a fresh looking into the indigenous history.

Thereafter, Dr. A.C. Das, Principal, EASTERN KARBI ANGLONG COLLEGE gave the presidential speech. He offered warm welcome to the resource persons, participants and all present. He expressed hope that such seminar would add to knowledge, experience of the EASTERN KARBI ANGLONG COLLEGE community particularly and in general on such relevant theme.

This was followed by vote of thanks was that offered by Mr. Bedabrata Bora Dept. of English. He expressed thankfulness to all, particularly keynote speaker, thanked all the resource persons, paper presenters and participants of the seminar.



KEYNOTE ADDRESS BY Dr. Michael Heneise, Centre for South Asian Studies, University of Edinburg

Panel Discussion on the theme: Date: 11th April, 2017 Time: 11:30 To 12:30

Mr. Pankaj Teron chaired the panel discussion and introduced the theme. THE PANELISTS OF THE DISCUSSION WERE MR. DHARAMSING Teron, Mr. S. Pait and Dr. Michael Heinese. The Panel Discussion began with Mr. S. Pait starting off the discussion. Mr. Pait spoke on the theme – "Doing Tribal History of the North East India: Challenges and prospects", outlining customs and traditions of the different tribal living in the North East India. Next DharamsingTeron deliberated on the theme highlighting the indigenous Karbi ethnic history. He noted that while doing history we have to look upon the folklore, culture, religious practices and oral tradition of a particular tribe. His discussion suggested that the Karbi history is centred to the North East Studies. Then Mr. Heinese deliberated on the theme, noting that the critical studies have been undermining structure like institutions. He encouraged all to be critical historians.

Then, in Question hour session, a few questions were raised by the participants on the issue of tribal history. Mr. S. Pait one of the penalists answered to some of the questions with the help of contextual examples. Dr. M. Heinese spoke on the issue of research and its fruitfulness, in reference to a question raised by Mr. Porag Sharma Dept of English, EASTERN KARBI ANGLONG COLLEGE. He stressed on the need of becoming a passionate critical thinker. Mr. DharamsingTeron elaborated on the issue of marginalization of communal history in the process of domination history as raised by Mr. BedabrataBora, Dept. of English EASTERN KARBI ANGLONG COLLEGE. With this the discussion the session cameto an end.



FIRST TECHNICAL SESSION

Moderated by Mr. SiddarthaPait ,Asst.Professor, Dept. Of History, Dibrugarh University

Bhruigumoni Nath Asstt. Prof. Dept. of History traced the history of Buddhism in his paper entitled Impact of Buddhism. In this paper he emphasised the relevance of Buddhism in the central of modern world. He gave importance in his paper the rituals of the tai-khamiyang society which are in the brink of oblivion due to lack of practice and also due mainly to lack of exposure. Tai-Khamiyang also excelled in weaving and in various crafts which have not been explored properly and so the outside world is not aware of it.

Rajdeep Bora, in his paper tried to explain the basic concept of Mathematics in the light of a tribal Society. Inhis paper he in explicit terms tried to define what is called golden rectangle. Golden rectangle played a very crucial role in human body and also in maintaining harmony in a tribal society.

Anita Das, in her paper 'Local Self Government in Assam' is threw light on the nature of self-government adopted through Panchayatiraj System. In her paper it was described how local self-government adopted a very crucial role in minimising local disputes among the people. Correct administrative measures can be taken through the local self-government. She in her paper explained how different administrative parts like 'Saikia' 'Hazarika' were created during Ahom rule to settle local disputes among the people. She also elaborated in her paper how institutions like 'Namghar' played a very significant role in the society in ushering an era of harmony and good will. Reservation system is serving as a bridge in reducing gap between the privileged and under privilege classes in the society and she dully gave prominence to it.


Aditya Gogoi, in his paper stressed on preserving the traditional values of a tribal society as these traditions are on the verge of being extinction due to lack of proper initiative to preserve them. In this paper sufficient importance was attached to various departmental works being initiated by the District Council of Karbi Anglong but it is a matter of much concern that these developmental works have not reached the common people and as much they have still remained deprived of the basic needs of life. He in his paper mentioned about the various provisions the constitution of India has granted to the areas of the six schedules so that these backward areas can make progress along with the rest of the part of the country. He identified various factors responsible for the sluggishness in the development of the region.

Anand Khati in his paper dwelt on the education system prevailing in the North Eastern region of India in general and Karbi Anglong in particular. Education, according to him, is a strong tool to bring about drastic changes to the society. He in his paper explained that more than 60% people are still languishing under poverty and this situation has been aggravated the strikingly alarming high rate of illiteracy. Problem of connectivity is another major hurdle in the path of scorching the light of education to the remotest places in Karbi Anglong and this has been resulted in imparting quality education in Karbi Anglong: He also forwarded in his paper some remedial measures to do away with the problem which have corroded the Karbi Society both economically and academically.

Certificates have been issued to these participants at the end of the session.

3RD SESSION: DATE: 12-04-2017

Moderated by Dr. Pranjal Bora Associate Professor, Dept. of English Dikhowmukh College, Guest Faculty Dibrugarh University.

Out of ten papers, first of all the paper was presented by Borson Kro-Traditional Administration. He emphasizes on the good administrative system of Rongkhang Kingdom having the power division between Central and Regional. Chinthong, Kingship is also highlighted. 'Riso-basa' the smallest unit which can be called a village.

2) 'Religious Practices of Karbi Community' Presented by KarengIngtipi: She stresses on the rites and rituals of Karbi tribe. Divine retribution of 'Chomkan' (heavenly abode) and the judgement of 'Sin' and

'holiness' is also highlighted. The belief of re-incarnation is also believed by the Karbi people. She also emphasised on the 'Tolemism' of the Karbi tribe. Regarding marriage system of the Karbis is also are also presented among the Karbis which are sometimes touched in the presentation. Some 'toba negative as she explained.

3) Joint Paper: Karbi LametAmei: Its role in asserting the Karbi Identity.

Song is emphasized 'Luku' fortheNoktae's is prime festival relating ploughing and harvesting. The internal similarity of the three tribes is also highlighted in the paper.
- 6) Geeta Hansepi: Karbi-SristimulakAkayanGeetatjanabiswas: A Study Main emphasis is on the oral songs of the Karbis. The richness of the Karbi folk Tales especially the oral song in the form of choice tuning is highlighted. One 'Lunse' as a village singer is assigned as described in the paper. Moving strong telling through folk ballad is the main focus of the paper.
- 7) Joint paper Presented by Dr.Kusumbar Barua and MonalishaRongpi on Sabin Alun. It highlights on the creation of Songs, with its table. Main stress is on the significance of 'Sabin Alun' on the imagination and sensibility of the Karbi people. Cremation rituals of Karbis as narrated in 'Sabin Alun' is highlighted. Folk architecture of the Karbis has been highlighted in Sabin Alun.
- 8) MenoshreeBorthakur presented a paper on "Borduwa than uddharatDamudarataaru Karbi Ahom rojarbhumika" AtiAAlusona: She described Damodar Ata as a distinguished social organiser of the Post. Sanskar era. The paper further contemplated on the role played by the Karbi King Ahom King Jaydhaj Singh.
- 9) Dr.ParasarKonwar delivered a presentation on his paper: "Poverty and Human Development among the Mising tribe in Assam: A Multi dimensional Approval" The Paper examines the poverty and human development among the Mising tribe in Dhemaji, Sivasagar and Charaideo districts of Assam from multi dimensional angle. The paper gives emphasis on the government and civil society taking up politics for amelioration of standard of living thereby building hence residence to reduce poverty.

With the presentation of the above nine papers, the session came to an end

During Question known Dr.Mousumi Choudhary put a question on the paper on Subonsiri Project as if Subonsiri Project has any relation with the tribal population of the North East. The paper presenter answered to the question with his capacity.

Mr. Pranjal Bora, one of the resource Persons summed up the session, by highlighting on the findings relevant in the papers. He deliberated on ethnic issues while contemporarily on and re- writing tribal history of North East.

Dr. Michael Heneise also summed up the findings of the papers by and urged upon to delve deep into the knowledge system for consideration of this tribal history.

FOURTH TECHNICAL SESSION

Moderated by Dr. Michael Heneise, Centre for South Asian Studies, University of Edinburg

The session commenced with the presentation of the on 'Ethnic Violent Conflict and Haonizaion of the undivided Karbi Anglong: A study by Jeetendra Harijar. In his paper the reformed to ethnic conflicts such as Karbi-Dimasa, Karbi-Kuki, Karbi-Naga, Karbi-Hindibhasi, Karbi-Khasi etc. He noted that such conflicts lead to the ethnic armed groups in Karbi Anglong, thereby creating a tense environment, internal displacement, social and so on. The paper attempts to tried out concrete resolution for allotment of resolution, peace and harmony in the society.

The second paper of the session is on "A study of traditional Marriage system of Karbi tribes is Karbi Anglong" by Sadananda Jidung. He described marriage as a traditional ritual of human life. He spoke in length on the different types of marriage of Karbi tribe. The paper offered a discussion on how Karbi tribe strictly follow the marriage custom, referring to the various stages of the marriage system.

The third paper prescribed was on "Chomkan: The Karbi Death Ritual Ceremony: Its significance in Karbi Society". It was by Suresh Timung. In his paper he refused to Chomkan as an important socioreligious cultural festival of the Karbi tribe by means of which Karbi tribe pays respect to the departed souls of the family members. The paper aims to trace the history of Chomkan with a view to highlighting the significance of Chomkan as a ritual in the Karbi Society.

The fourth paper entitled "Cultural Attitude of Karbi People of NE India: An Investigation" by Mithun Roy. The paper consider the topography of North East as as essential basis for emergence of beautiful ethnic cultural affinity. The paper attempts to investigate into the attitude of Karbi people in relation to their cultural activities.

The Last paper for the seminar was on "HabeMethai (the marriage songs) of the Boros" An overview by LankeshwarHaizary.

He narrated in his paper that 'Habe' means 'marriage' and 'HabeMethai' means marriage songs for the Boros. He showed in the paper how marriage could conclude with songs. The paper tries to explore the usage and messages latest in the "HabeMethai".

During the Question Hour of this session, a question was put in reform to obvious ethnic conflicts in Karbi Anglong against the paper by Jeetendra Hajai. He added to the question his especially which second note to give justification to his stand. Another question put by Mousumi Choudhary in reference to the by Suresh Timung. The question was "what was new in the paper" as the things contained in are already published.



FIFTH TECHNICAL: DATE: 12-04-2017 Time: 3.20 PM

Moderated by Dr. Pranjal Bora Associate Professor, Dept. of English, Dikhowmukh College, Guest Faculty Dibrugarh University

The session, chaired by **Dr. Pranjal Bora** started off with the presentation of "Human Rights Violation". The writer has stressed in his paper on the population of the district of Karbi Anglong victimised of human rights violation and human crisis. She noted that the colonial mindset is alienating the tribal population—the mainstream development has witnessed no substantial change in the post colonial Assam. Thus the paper is as attempt to explore the deplorable living condition of the Karbi ethnic tribe in Duk village, Kania Engti village, Sarthe Phangcho village, Sing Tisso village etc. the paper is based on historical, sociological and anthropological study.

The second paper entitled "Karbi Relation and Neighbouring tribes" by KadombiriTerangpi. Her paper highlights the important aspects of cultural interaction with Jaintia and Dimasa tribe.

The third paper entitled "Continuity and Changes A study of traditional Administrative System of the Karbi" by Rupmili Terangpi seeks to answer the question: how on Autonomous District Council have been able to preserve, protect and continue the Karbi Culture, laws and customs, political structure, language, dress etc.

The fourth paper presented by Udita Das was on "Educative value of Karbi Traditional Festivals": In her paper she cited some important festivals of Karbi such as Chojun, Botor Kekur, Chomkan, Peng Karkli etc. The paper aims to find out the endeavour value of the Karbi Traditional Festivals.

The fifth paper entitled state Local Relation: Altering trends in Executive of Autonomous Council of Karbi Anglong" by BanditaTeronpi highlights the change in the trend of made of functioning of the Autonomus Council of Karbi Anglong rights from its while observing the changing trend in the state local relations.

The Sixth paper entitled "Local Administrator and Environmental Severance" with particular reform in the power of KAAC is practising environmental degradation" by Durmily Hansepi seeks to analyse and examine the role of local administration with special reform in the functions of KAAC in maintaining and protecting environmental degradation either through the implementation of various Acts and Laws within its jurisdiction.

The last paper of this session entitled "Social Policy Analysis": Tribal Development Policy of the Govt. of India 'by Reeta Kramsapi – seeks to examine the ground reality of poor indigenous people while having to deal with the government.

With this presentation the session came to a close.




Valedictory Session: Date: 12th April, 17 TIME: 3:00 PM to 4:30 PM





(6) Report on Webinar


Conducted by the department of Mathematics,

The resource person for the webinar was Prof. Kalayan Chakraborty, Director of Kerala School of Mathematics.




The programme started with an opening speech delivered by Dr.Tazmin Sultana, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics was also the coordinator of the webinar.



The seminar helped in gaining a better insight into the subject and also developed the feeling of cooperation among the students.


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(9) Webinar on Video Contest called 'Population Talk' to observe World Population Day (11 July 2021)
